**COURSE INFORMATION**

<b>Course Catalog Description (Content)</b>	Divisions of Roman armies, Praetorian Cohors, Vigiles, Urban Cohors, Classis, Legio, Description of ala, Cohors, Equites units in Auxilia, formation of Alas: Ala Quingenaria, formation of Ala Milliarum units and number of soldiers, number of Roman Legions, their naming, the regions where they are deployed giving detailed information about legions (number of legions, number of cohorts etc.), Roman military ranks, Military clothing, armors, weapons and mechanical weapons such as catapults. Topics constitute the content of the course.
<b>The Aim of the Course</b>	The aim of this course, from the establishment of the Roman army system to the permanent legions, Marius' reforms, explaining the organization chart, naming the Legions, Organizing and explaining the military units such as Ala, Cohors, Centuria and Numerus, Locations of the Legions, Strata Diocletiana system, Military weapons, Military clothing, armors, to have information about such matters.
